Only make your report when you can do so safely!

What to Report:

- Funnel cloud, Tornado, or Waterspout
- Winds over 40 mph, or wind damage
- Hail of any size
- Flooding (standing or flowing)
- Weather related injuries or fatalities
- Snow, Ice, or Fog making travel hazardous

When Making a Report:

- **WHO** you are: Spotter, Amateur Radio, name, etc
- **WHAT** you have seen
- **WHERE** the event is occurring
- **WHEN** the event happened
- **MOVEMENT** of tornado, waterspout, or funnel cloud (if possible)

Estimating Hail Size

1/4 - 1/2 inch	Pea
3/4 inch	Penny
1 inch	Quarter
1 1/4 inch	Half Dollar
1 1/2 inch	Ping Pong
1 3/4 inch	Golf Ball
2 inch	Egg/Plume
2 1/2 inch	Tennis Ball
2 3/4 inch	Baseball
3 inch	Softball
4 inch	Grapefruit



Estimating Wind Speeds

Speed	Observations
19-24 mph	Fresh wind, small trees sway
25-31 mph	Large branches sway, wires whistle
32-38 mph	Whole trees sway, walking tough
39-46 mph	Twigs and small branches break off
47-54 mph	Branches break, minor structural damage
55-63 mph	Large limbs break, trees uprooted, structural damage
64-74 mph	Widespread damage, trees snapped



Estimating Visibility

Car Odometer Method

- 1 - Choose target at visibility range
- 2 - Check odometer
- 3 - Drive to target, recheck odometer

Estimating Rain Intensity

Light: ≤ 0.1 " per hour, individual drops seen

Moderate: $0.11 \leq 0.3$ " per hour, individual drops not clearly seen, spray visible just above the pavement

Heavy: ≤ 0.3 " per hour, falling in a torrent, heavy spray seen above the pavement



Flooding

Do not drive into flooded areas!

- Is the water up to the wheel cover, base of door, or over the hood on cars?
- Is the water over curbs, or into yards?
- Are roads closed or impassable?
